



## Bronze Duke of Ed Adventurous Journey

### Royal National Park, Sydney

### RNP2B Otford to Bundeena - 27km: 2 days / 1 night

#### **SUPERVISORS:**

Supervisors are qualified in First Aid, have Working with Children Clearance and carry emergency communication equipment.

#### **ITINERARY:**

#### **Day 1: Otford to Wattamolla**

(GPS coordinates of campsite: -34.138719, 151.117567)

14km. Grading: moderate, some hard.

Walking along Royal National Park's stunning Coast Track we'll have views, views and more views... and a couple of hills. We'll stop for lunch at Garie Beach where flush toilets and tank water are available. Tank water will need to be purified. From lunch we'll climb some more steep hills to reach our campsite at mid afternoon. The campsite at Wattamolla is a grassy expanse by the ocean with flushing toilets and tank water, which will need to be purified. Swimming is permitted in the lagoon at Wattamolla.

#### **Day 2: Wattamolla to Bundeena**

13km. Grading: moderate.

Another day of sweeping ocean views without the hills today. Refill tank water at camp in the morning and detour inland for a short distance before following the coast north to Bundeena. Some sandy sections again but mostly walking on sandstone cliffs and dirt track.

## **DRINKING WATER:**

We recommend drinking 3 litres of water per day plus 1 litre to cook with at night. 1 litre of water weighs 1 kg. Please keep this in mind when packing. After the first day you should adjust this up or down depending on your water intake.

We anticipate creek and tank water being available every day, but this is never certain. Creek and tank water should be treated before drinking, see briefing notes for more details.

## **CREEK CROSSINGS:**

A creek crossings occurs on Day 2 you may get wet. We do not anticipate high water on this hike but will keep you informed leading up to your journey and your hiking supervisors will make decisions on creek crossings in the field.

## **TOILETS:**

A flush toilet is available at lunch on Day 1 and our campsite on Night 1. At all other times toilet waste must be buried and you will need to bring a trowel for this purpose.
